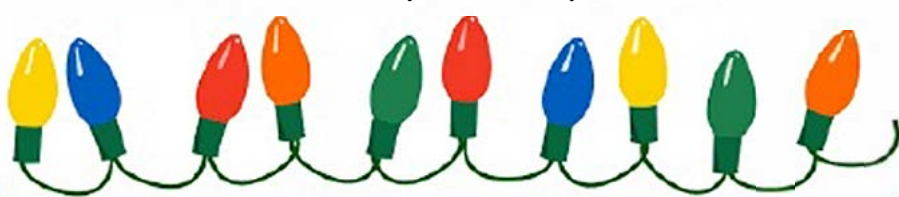

The POA Board of Directors will hold a regular POA meeting on Monday, December 12 with the presentation of the 2023-24 preliminary budget to follow afterwards. The meeting will take place at 7:30 p.m. in the Seasons Lakehouse ballroom. The second meeting with the proposed budget will be presented on January

9, 2023 with the approval of the budget on January 23, 2023. The board encourages residents' input, so they can assure that the upcoming year is supported for the needs of the community.

Leaf collections will continue until December 14 or until the weather makes it too difficult to do so. The leaf vacs cannot suck up frozen leaf piles. This is a large task for the residents and the

Operations Department to attend to every year and I want to commend everyone for the job you do. Every leaf collected is one more leaf that won't accumulate into the lakes, swales, and culverts. **DO NOT BLOW LEAVES INTO ANY OF THE LAKES!**

Branch collections have been completed for the year so please refrain from placing branches out after the normal collection times.

The only other time the Operations Department will collect branches from property owners beyond the normal collection time is if

a storm event has knocked branches off of your tree. If you do have branches needing collection after a storm event please contact the Operations Department at 219-988-4461.

You must contact a contractor to remove your branches or trees from your property for all other reasons. You also have the option to bring your branches to the Operations facility at 3861 Kingsway Drive during normal operating hours.

Live Christmas trees will be collected by the Operations department start-

ing Monday, January 2 until Friday, January 13. Please remove all decorations before placing them on your road berm for collection.

The Operations Department has been marking the roadway curves and critical areas with painted stakes before the ground freezes so they can efficiently plow the roads, cul-de-sacs, and parking lots in case of snow. The trucks will be prepared and awaiting our first big snow. I would like to remind residents to please not push or blow snow onto the roads as this only creates

a dangerous situation for those driving.

STAY OFF THE ICE

Please stay off the ice and please keep an eye on anyone that you may see walking around or on the ice, including animals. Please contact the Security Department to inform them when you see anyone walking on the ice.

The POA office will be closed the week of December 26 for the holidays and will reopen on Monday, January 2, 2023.

December has arrived along with the colder temperatures. The leaves are gone from the trees but there is still beauty to be found, like a fresh snowfall and beautifully decorated houses and yards in the community. When you get the opportu-

Now that winter is here, there should not be any vehicles parking on the berms or in the street. They need to be kept clear, so they don't interfere with the Operations Department when they are plowing the roads. No one wants to see a vehicle get damaged because it was parked where it shouldn't be parked.

If you are having guests and you leave a vehicle at one of the Four Seasons parks due to there not being enough room in your driveway, be sure to contact the Security Department. You will need to let them know how long the vehicle will be there, a description of the vehicle, and your name and contact information. Parking at the parks is for special circumstances only, not to be done on a regular basis.

cold, please pay extra attention to your pets. Do not leave them outdoors for long periods of time. Be sure they have shelter, food and water. If they start barking, please bring them indoors. Security receives many calls about dogs barking because they were left out in the cold.

Many of our residents know how long the lines are to come into the community on the holidays. Please advise your guests that are coming in on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day to have your address ready when they pull up to the window to sign in. Being unprepared is one of the things that contributes to the long lines. The Dispatchers along with the people waiting in line appreciate anything that can be done to make the line go faster.

Last of all, the employees of the Security Department would like to wish everyone a safe, healthy and happy holiday season.

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An old book reveals interesting finds about our region and its settlers

Readers of this column may recall a series of articles about the early days in Porter Township, as taken from an old library book published in 1882. We turn our attention to the early people of Winfield Township and their activities, as taken from that book.

The first permanent settler in what would be Winfield Township was Jeremy Hixon, who located a claim about April 1, 1835, which at that

time was Center Township, one of only three townships in Lake County. For some time, there was no houses nearer than five miles of his. He and his family camped in a wagon while building a log hut for a home.

Winfield Township was formed in 1843 from a portion of Center Township, and elections were to be held at the home of George Woodbridge. In 1844, the west tier of the township was placed back into Center Township, and three southwest sections were assigned to Eagle Creek Township. Jeremy Hixon is credited

with naming the new township in honor of Winfield Scott, an early military general.

Early settlers of the new township included William Nichols, William Roe, and Jesse Roby. The latter was a pioneer carpenter and hunter. His skill in log house building was equaled only by his accuracy as a marksman. It was said that he shot as many as twenty deer before he stopped to skin one. Somewhat later, newer arrivals included Major Jack Downing, John Lindsey, James Corbin, and Miles Mattox, followed by William

Clark, Asahel Gregg, Simeon Gordon, and William Welch, among others.

Quite a large number of settlers followed, and the log huts grew among the groves of trees. On a calm morning, the smoke from many stick and mortar chimneys curled up from among the thinned out trees. Most early settlers of the township came from Ohio, Pennsylvania, and New York. Some came from Canada, England, Scotland, Ireland, Germany and France.

The Potawatomi Indians remained in the township for several years after the

white settlement. It was said that Lorne, a son of Jeremy Hixon, and a number of boys, and it is supposed, girls, too, used to play with the little Potawatomi papooses, and learned the Indian language. There were several Indian mounds near the house of Jeremy Hixon, but the plow aided by the weather had obliterated them. Numerous arrow heads, stone axes, and other Indian implements have been found in the area.

The early pioneers had obvious hardships. Michigan City was the nearest trading post and post office in 1835 and for some years after.

The nearest grist mill was at Scott's, some five miles further. Trips to these places were usually made by ox teams, also used for plowing. One man usually made a trip of several days to a mill or trading point, which also included assistance for his neighbors, and they in return reciprocated. One doctor resided in the township in its early days.

In two future articles, we'll describe some early interesting events in Winfield Township and biographies of certain prominent citizens of that time. Stay tuned!

A reminder about LOFS snow removal procedures

The Lakes of the Four Seasons Operations Department wants residents to be cautious and prepared during the winter season. The department's snow removal procedures are as follows:

- Plow and salt trucks are used when the conditions deem it necessary. The Security Department is to contact the on-call maintenance personnel of bad road conditions during off hours between the hours of 4 p.m.

and 7:30 a.m. weekdays, on weekends and holidays.

- Plowing will continue until midnight and begin again at 4 a.m. on weekdays.

Priorities

- Front Entrance, N.L.S.D., 117th Ave. Automated Entrance, Kingsway Dr., W.L.S.D., Porter County Automated Entrance, Four Seasons Parkway.
- Forest Lane, Sunnyslope Dr., E.L.S.D., Green Valley Dr., Hidden Valley Dr.
- All remaining roads.
- Cul-de-sacs, Seasons Lakehouse parking lots and 19th Hole parking lots.

- Seasons Lakehouse sidewalks and 19th Hole sidewalks.

The Lakes of the Four Seasons Operations Department and employees will not be held responsible for any damages to mailboxes or stands that are already in disrepair.

The Operations Department requests the following from drivers and residents:

- Yield the right of way to the plow and salt trucks for your safety and the operator's safety.
- Vehicles must not be parked on or along roadways and cul-de-sacs. The Operations Department needs as much open area as possible to place the snow

and to maneuver through the narrow roadways.

- Please do not put snow from your driveway into the streets. Frozen snow piles when hit with the plow, could force plow trucks into oncoming traffic.
- Place the snow on the left side (downstream of road traffic) of your driveway as you face it.

The GMS crews will begin working in the LOFS area

in the coming weeks. Their task will involve taking a physical inventory of each pole, transformer, etc., on the system. Crews will be in vehicles marked with the KV REMC logo and be seen using trucks, on foot, or ATVs to access equipment.

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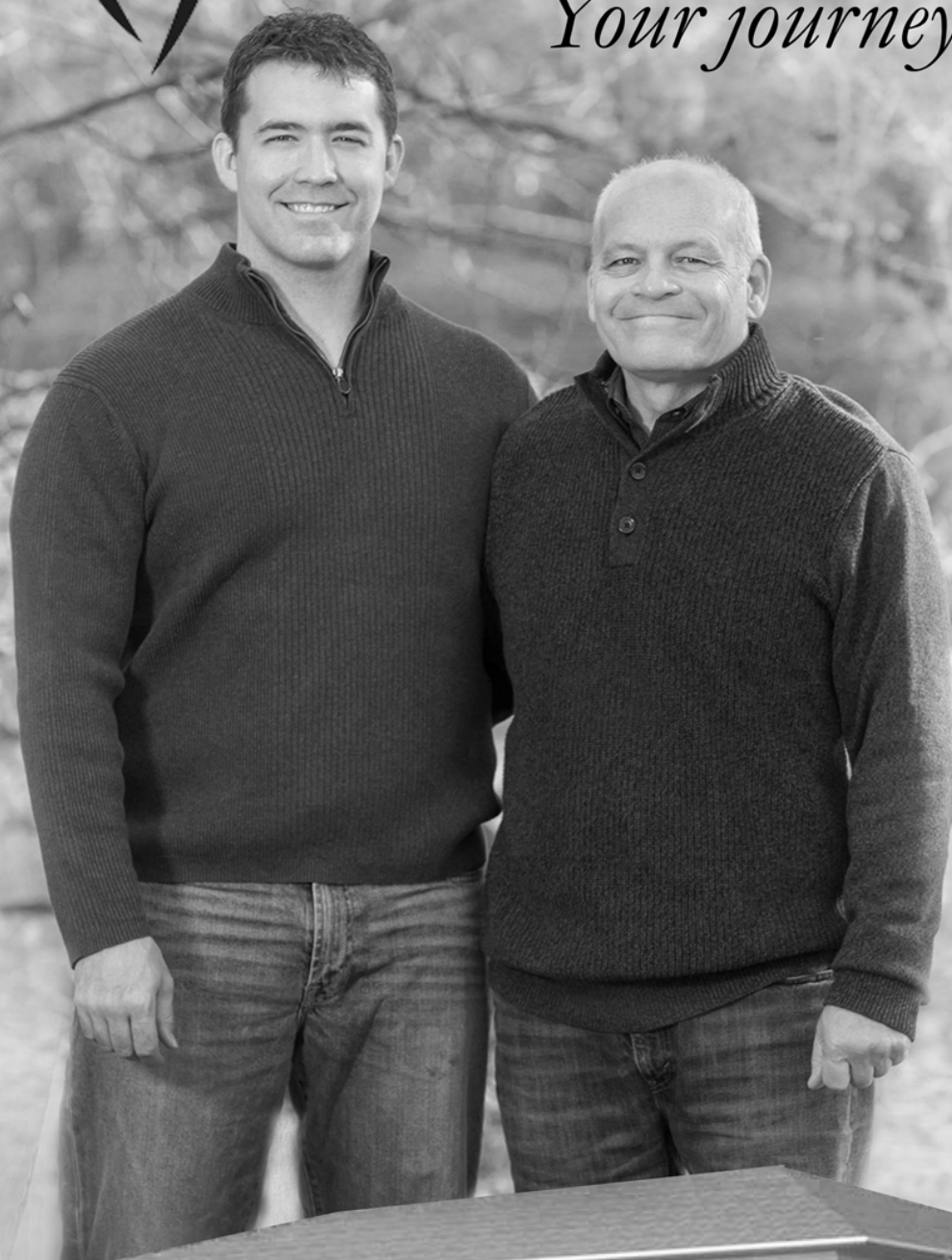
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Keenagers

Campaign to support Hoosier youth at-risk for justice involvement, substance misuse announced

The Indiana Family and Social Services Administration's Division of Mental Health and Addiction launched a new program to support Hoosier youth in building a stronger sense of self through the 'Believe in You' campaign. The campaign includes resources focusing on specific topics and behaviors that have been identified as risk areas for alcohol and substance misuse, such as developing mental strength, positive thinking, coping techniques, and self-control.

Community groups or or-

ganizations that engage with youth are invited to consider adopting the program and encouraging youth to opt-in.

Youth who engage with the 'Believe in You' campaign will receive a series of weekly text messages that provide a mix of verbal and written support, education, polls, questions and links to a video portal. The videos focus on specific topics identified by Hoosier youth as critical points of importance to them and their mental wellness, including mental wellbeing support, inspirational stories and helpful information

from mentors, health professionals, peers and influential members of the community.

As an added layer of encouragement, youth who take the campaign's challenge to have a sponsor to guide them through program may be eligible to receive an additional incentive. At the end of each four-week challenge period, participants meet with their sponsor to discuss the program's messaging and takeaways. In exchange, each participant may be eligible to receive a \$10 gift card for their participation. While having a sponsor is encouraged for the

campaign, it is not required for youth to opt-in.

To opt in to the 'Believe in You' direct message program, text BEYOU to 877-861-6807.

For additional information on how to leverage this program in your community, contact Amber Becker, DMHA Director of Child, Youth, and Family Systems, at 317-232-8908 to sign up for a 30-minute virtual training session.

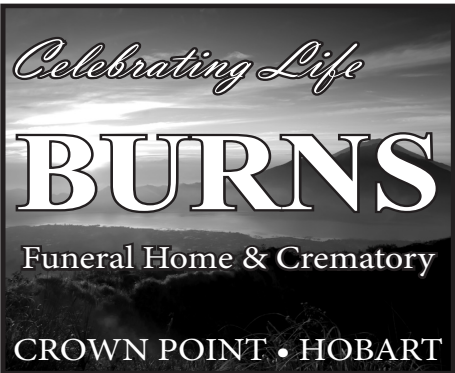
