





CART PATHS FOR NON-GOLFING PURPOSES.

Security has been receiving complaints of fireworks. Per Lakes of the Four Seasons resolution #2007-06 11 the discharge of State of Indiana approved fireworks is limited to the following dates and times.



Jim 'Sock It To Me' Sasaki is a Region veteran on bass guitar with a wealth of talent and skill. He's well-known in the music scene, often lending his chops to other projects in the Region.

Highway originated in The Region, a tough blue-collar area southeast of Chicago where hundreds of bands battle for exposure and gigs. They have risen to the challenge, delivering powerful onstage shows week after week, year after year. Highway has tapped into the primal source of rock music, the blues, and followed its evolution through seminal bands such as The Allman Brothers Band, The Rolling Stones, and Cream. Their original music acknowledges their musical debt to these bands without sacrificing passion and freshness.

They have shared the stage with Lynyrd Skynyrd, Jackyl, Foreigner, and Styx and have played the Tommy Jeans stage at Chicago's Tweeter Center and Charter One Pavilion at Northerly Island Chicago. Blending their two instruments into one, they invoke Keith Richards and Brian Jones on those great early Stones records.

Tim Dailey's bass- playing is equal parts Bootsy Collins and Paul McCartney- funky and melodic. Drummer Glenn Miller approaches the drum kit with the swing of Charlie Watts and the power Party Foul of John 'Bonzo' Bonham.

Talented and hardworking, a good-time rock and roll band. A Highway show is a party. They bring back the good times when a rock 'n' roll song you could dance to and sing along with wasn't too much to ask.


Old newspaper clippings tell about Lakes of the Four Seasons early planning

Α previ ous article

detailed highlights from old newspaper clippings from 1966 about the planning of The Seasons, and this series continues, both verbatim and by recapping.

"Earlier in the day, the same people gave similar information to the Lake County plan group. An April target date will be announced when the developers will give full complete plans to members County Plan Commissions."

"Spokesmen included John S. Keating, president of the firm, and Kenneth Schellie, Indianapolis consultant, who has been retained to handle site development. The ambitious project will be called 'Lakes of the Four Seasons', Keating stated. 'This will satisfy those people who are seeking something they can't find in this area', he said. He also added, 'When Interstate 65 is extended, people living in our area will be 20 minutes from downtown Gary and

of both the Porter and Lake less than an hour's drive from downtown Chicago'.

> Schellie said that the project fits an amendment to the zoning code in Porter County permitting planned developments and will culminate in

a fully oriented community." "Keating said there will be space for 2,700 families, but he expected development to be slow. He was asked by county surveyor William Tanke, a member of the plan group, if the land firm had any plans to improve access roads into the area. Keating said he didn't, but the members of the community would

care for their own road maintenance and snow removal. The complex would have its own sewage and water systems."

"County Superintendent of Schools Charles McMurtry was concerned about potential school problems. 'All the property surrounding this area is agricultural and has no industrial base', McMurtry said. 'If you develop 2,700 homes, taxes from residences will not support the schools'. Schellie said sufficient land would be set aside for at least two school sites. He said each tract would contain 10 acres, but McMurtry said that this might not be enough."

"Schellie said the earthen dams will hold the water in two lakes. He estimated the water would be 20 to 25 feet deep at the head of the dam."

"The developers will fly members of the Lake and Porter County plan commissions, board of commissioners and other interested persons to similar developments in the east. The group of 28 will leave February 5 and return the following day."



Golf Maintenance

Long, cold Spring is in the past and now we are in the middle of a hot dry spell. The areas of the rough that are not irrigated are starting to slow down and thin out. The areas of the course that are irrigated have remained healthy and actively growing.

The golf course uses Lake Holiday to irrigate from, and the lake level is starting to lower. If this trend continues, we will have to alter our irrigation practices. Like in years past, wetting agents are used on the turf to help the water penetrate the soil.

Wetting agents are non-ionic, which means they do not attach to soil particles. This creates channels for the water, allowing it to get to the roots.

Wetting agents are an important part of water conservation. The greens, tees, and fairways have been sliced aerified, which allows not just water to penetrate the soil but also the exchange of gasses needed for healthy turf. The best part of slicing is that it doesn't affect the playability of the golf course.

The driving range mats have been installed and look great. The entire project was completed prior to the Member/Guest Invitational. The area around the cement has been seeded and netted.

Please be careful when walking on the netting it can get stuck in the spikes of golf shoes. There are areas where plywood was placed to allow golfers heading to the grass part of the range to cross over. Next on the project list is the ladies' tees on holes six and eleven.

Now that most golfers are driving by themselves, the amount of carts on the course has increased dramatically. Please stay on the cart path as much as possible. Also, please stay at least 30 feet from the greens. We are playing the ball down so if the cart traffic kills the areas around the greens then we will have to change the ball



- Applicants must be attending a University in the same or following year they are applying.
- Applicants must submit an application to verify they are eligible.
- Applicants must submit an essay, no more than 500 words, regarding the impact that the game of golf has had on his or her life and how they anticipate the game, and its lessons will impact their future.
- Applicants must submit their application and essay by July 20th of the year applying.

A committee consisting of the entire Lakes of the Four Seasons Men's Golf Association Board and the Head of the Lakes of the Four Seasons Junior Golf Program, shall determine the recipients of the Scholarships. The committee members shall rank applicants of each sex based on their application and essay, with the number one being that which they prefer the most. The male applicant and the female applicant receiving the lowest total when all committee members' rankings are added together shall be deemed the winners. the event persons of both sexes do not apply, 2 scholarships may be awarded to those that did apply regardless of sex, if so, decided by majority vote of the Lakes of the Four Seasons Men's Golf Association Board. In the event any committee member is related to an applicant, that member shall recuse himself or herself from that vote to prevent any appearance of impropriety. The Treasurer of the Lakes of the Four Seasons Men's Golf Association Board shall make checks for the Scholarships payable only to the University that the winning applicant(s) will be attending. The renewal of this program shall be decided annually by majority vote of the LOFS Men's Golf Association Board. It shall be the duty of the Vice President of the LOFS Men's Golf Association Board to promote and coordinate this program annually to scholarship candidates.


