### **Reminder to All Residents** Every outdoor receptacle

for ashes, trash, rubbish, or garbage shall be so placed and kept as not to be visible from any street, lake, or golf course within the subdivision at any time except for the times when refuse collections are being made. 4 p.m., prevailing time, on the day before the scheduled day of refuse collection, shall be the earliest time that property owners may place trash receptacles out for collection.

All trash and recycle receptacles shall be stored no later than midnight on the

day of collection. Election

These containers are for the use of residents and their guests visiting the parks and are not for residents' personal use. If you are caught using these containers for your personal use you will be issued a citation that will cost you more than the monthly trash & recycling service fee.

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

Once the weather warms up, Security gets quite a few calls in regard to noise complaints. (Covenant 7.1) In General No activities prohibited defined as, or held to be a nuisance under Indiana Law shall be carried on within the subdivision, nor any activity deemed obnoxious by the Association. The fine is \$50.00 for non-compliance after a first warning. Just a reminder, Security is enforcing the covenant

for underage kids operating a golf cart. Which carries a \$100 fine. And please be patient with the dispatchers at the gate. Remember to tell the guest to have the address ready and use the guest lane. This will help to keep traffic moving.

Lakes Director A reminder to all LOFS residents about specific rules of the Lakes:

Big Bass Lake shall always be idle speed and/ or no wake. No motorboat powered by a motor having a horsepower rating more than ten (10) horsepower shall be operated on Big Bass Lake. If the boat's horsepower is more than ten (10), it can still be permitted for use on Big Bass Lake, if the motor is completely out of the water and not in use.

No watercraft without a current POA decal shall be allowed into the community unless it is being towed by an automobile with a cur-

rent POA decal or the property owner has contacted the Security Department to inform them that their watercraft is being delivered by a third party. Only LOFS property owners are permitted to place any watercraft into any LOFS lakes and only after proper registration with the POA The placement of any watercraft that is registered to someone other than a POA property owner into any

ited. Violation of this rule will result in immediate removal of the watercraft from LOFS, and the owner of the watercraft will be prohibited from entering LOFS, and trespassing charges will be filed



# Old newspaper clippings tell about Lakes of the Four Seasons early planning

Nowadays, it seems quite often that we learn about a new subdivision being planned or started in the Winfield area, as we peruse the local daily newspapers or their e-editions. If we turn the clock back about 56 years and read old newspaper clippings about the planning of LOFS, many similarities seem to exist.

This writer had been given a number of copies of old newspaper articles about the planning and the creation

of the Lakes of The Four Seasons community. These articles are undated but presumed to be from early 1966. A few are datelined Gary and Valparaiso and are assumed to be from the Gary Post Tribune, the Valparaiso Vidette-Messenger, and perhaps the Hammond Times. They make interesting reading, and this and subsequent articles will describe these events, either verbatim or by recapping.

One headline read, "Subdivision For Population Equal To Present Crown Point Planned For Winfield Township Near Palmer", with a sub-caption, "Lake of 300 Acres To Be Created; Club and Community

School Sites Included."

The article continues, "Development of a subdivision of 1,700 acres in Winfield and Porter Townships with a potential of 10,000 population is announced this week by Bruce Fleming as agent for the Interstate Land Company. During the past two years Fleming has acquired 23 properties for the promoter company covering an irregularly shaped area two miles wide east and west and two miles north and south.'

Continuing, "The site, larger than the city of Crown Point, is seven miles due east on Jenkins Road (now 109th Avenue), starting at

Building, Two Golf Courses, Palmer Road (now Randolph Street) and running east into Porter County. From Jenkins Road it extends south below Palmer. Four acres of the Kosbade farm on the southeast corner of Jenkins and Palmer Roads intersection is plotted for a supermarket. Sixty percent of the subdivision is in Lake County and 40 percent in Porter County."

"The development plan, Fleming says, is more than a subdivision for the construction of homesites. It will include recreational facilities available to homeowners with provisions being made for golf, boating, fishing, and water skiing. Engineers for the company are creating a 300-acre lake by the construction of a dam on the Herbert Grove high school." McLaughlin farm north of Palmer on 123rd Avenue near the Lake-Porter lines. Two 18-hole golf courses are also being designed on the Winfield Township portion of the land."

"Access to the subdivision will be limited to residents and guests at guarded gates. A clubhouse and community building is to be a part of the development along with utilities, golf courses and lake. Grade school sites will be given to Winfield and Porter townships. High school students in the Winfield portion will attend Crown Point high school and those on the Porter side will go to Boone

"A meeting has been scheduled for today (Thursday) for land company officers, Winfield township trustee Harry Batterman, and the advisory board to discuss school requirements. The Interstate Land company is a national organization with projects of a similar nature under development in Ohio, Washington, Illinois, Nebraska, and Mexico City. The company's expenditure for land is estimated to be \$1 million. The first stage of the development is expected to cost \$5 million.

The LOFS Men's Golf Association is pleased to announce the 13th annual Golf Scholarship awards for current and previous LOFS junior golf members.

A \$1,000 award will be issued to the college or university of their choice for one male and one female who have graduated high school this spring and will be attending said college or university in the fall.

Among the requirements to be met, parents or legal guardians of the applicants must be a current MGA member or LOFS resident in good standing at the time of the application, a minimum of 1 year of LOFS junior golf participation, a completed application to verify eligibility with a 500-word essay explaining how the game of golf and its lessons has impacted their life and what it holds for them in the future.

For further information, and to pick up and return the scholarship applications, please visit the LOFS Pro Shop. Entries must be received by June 17, 2022; winners will be notified by July 1, 2022.

### of their choice for one male and Olthoff: State funding gives green light to Winfield road improvements

Winfield will receive \$944,423 in state matching grants for road and bridge improvement projects, according to State Rep. Julie Olthoff (R-Crown Point).

In total, 223 towns, cities and counties will receive more than \$107 million in state funding through the Community Crossings Matching Grant Program. Funds, awarded twice a year, are for road and bridge preservation, road reconstruction, intersection improvements, guardrail replacements and signage, and can cover material costs for chip sealing and crack filling operations.

As part of the grant program, established in 2016 and expanded through laws supported by Olthoff, smaller municipalities provide a 25% match in local funds, while large communities provide a 50% match. State law requires 50% of the available matching funds be awarded annually to communities within counties with a population of 50,000 or fewer. To date, Hoosier communities are on the receiving end of more than \$1 billion in Community Crossings Matching Grants.


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

A committee consisting of the entire Lakes of the Four Seasons Men's Golf Association Board and the Head of the Lakes of the Four Seasons Junior Golf Program shall determine the recipients of the Scholarships. The committee members shall rank applicants of each sex based on their application and essay, with the number one being that which they prefer the most. The male applicant and the female applicant receiving the lowest total when all committee members' rankings are added together shall be deemed the winners. In the event persons of both sexes do not apply, 2 scholarships may be awarded to those that did apply regardless of sex, if so, decided by majority vote of the Lakes of the Four Seasons Men's Golf Association Board. In the event any committee member is related to an applicant, that member shall recuse himself or herself from that vote to prevent any appearance of impropriety. The Treasurer of the Lakes of the Four Seasons Men's Golf Association Board shall make checks for the Scholarships payable only to the University that the winning applicant(s) will be attending. The renewal of this program shall be decided annually by majority vote of the LOFS Men's Golf Association Board. It shall be the duty of the Vice President of the LOFS Men's Golf Association Board. 


