

LOFS straddles the local continental divide

tains updates from one authored by the writer and previously published in the July 1999 Seasonal)

Lake water came to the Winfield area in 1997, as a pipeline was laid southward along Randolph St. from Route 30, to furnish Lake Michigan water to the newer Double Tree Lakes developments, to other surrounding commercial interests, and to subdivisions west of Randolph. There were rumors that the Four Seasons would get lake water.

Most likely, the LOFS will never obtain lake water because of a geological phenomenon, a continental divide, which traverses our area, diverting water to both the Lake Michigan and the Mississippi River water-

When LOFS was developed, the sewage treatment plant, located just south of 123rd Ave., was designed to drain into the Kankakee River and Mississippi River watersheds and ultimately into the Gulf of Mexico. As the town of Winfield was being developed, it was permitted Lake Michigan water because the effluent from its sewage treatment plant,

located south of 109th Ave. ing lot at the pro shop, then behind the Meadows subdivision, drains into Deer Creek and ultimately back north into Lake Michigan. Under an international agreement among all Great Lakes states and Canadian provinces, Lake Michigan water cannot be diverted out of its watershed without unanimous approval of all participating

Locally, the town of Lowell, which has high fluoride in its well water, lies in the Kankakee River watershed, and was unsuccessful in the 1990's in several attempts to get approval for lake water.

The dividing line between the Lake Michigan watershed, leading to the Atlantic Ocean, and the Kankakee River watershed, which flows to the Gulf of Mexico, passes through LOFS. With a little investigative prowess and some knowledge about topography, that imaginary line--the local continental divide—can be determined. The accompanying map can be used as a guide to locate it.

The divide crosses County Road 100S as a small ridge just east of County Line Road and enters LOFS in the 1300 block of Brandywine Road. It goes south through the open field used as our golf course's practice driving range, between No. 1 and No. 18 fairways. The divide may go through the golf cart park-

proceeds across Sunnyslope Drive, goes south on Country Club Drive for a bit, then casually crosses No. 9 Fairway to Knollwood Dr. The divide crosses Lake Shore Drive, then skirts its west side downhill, then traverses uphill on the east side of Sunrise Drive. It crosses Sunrise and emerges at a point where Sunrise and Kingsway Drive meet.

If one stands in the middle of the intersection of Kingsway and Sunrise, looking southwest, the divide is visible as the middle of Sunrise for several hundred yards. Although higher ground is nearby, the development of LOFS has made Sunrise at this location as the continental divide. It then skirting No. 12 green, crossing Ravenswood Drive, then south across Westover Drive to Parkwood Place.

The divide then runs along the north side of Parkwood, crossing a small ridge into Lions Park. In the park, the divide is hard to distinguish, although it may very well pass through the new picnic pavilion. (Most water in the park drains southward.) The divide crosses Kingsway as a rise in the road, skirts the backyards of several houses on the west side, then exits LOFS as the crest of the hill just beyond the 117th Ave. gate. Lastly, it crosses Randolph St. as a small ridge just south of Ace Hardware.

Although most of our residents don't realize it, there are a number of houses in

LOFS that are exactly on the divide, and rain water falling from their roofs theoretically can flow to both the Atlantic Ocean and the Gulf of Mexico. A few houses that have this phenomenon include 1032 Lake Shore Drive, 2998 Sunrise, 3010 Sunrise, 3053 Sunrise, 4108

Ravenswood, and 3806 Kingsway. More homes can claim the same distinction. So, if you're riding around LOFS, it might be interesting to find the divide, or perhaps also to see if your home might indeed be a conversation piece.





Gardens Around the Community suggest cooler temperatures lead to perfect gardening

Now is the perfect time to garden. With cooler temperatures and rain (fingers crossed) mother nature will do all the work for your newly planted garden bed. Some plants we would recommend not to plant until Spring are Butterfly Bush (Buddleia) and Ornamental grass. The warm weather that Summer provides encourages their growth to sustain them throughout our unpredictable

Hydrangeas are showing off their colors. From shades of red, chartreuse green, and bountiful white. I can see the Pavilion from my backyard. The Limelight Hydrangeas look amazing even from a distance. Vanilla Strawberry Hydrangea with its creamy white color that slowly fades to a pink is in full bloom. It sits on the edge of the same flower bed. Be sure to check this beauty out.

The newly planted Pollinator Garden is doing lovely. It will be a joy to watch this garden bed flourish throughout the years. Remember this area will not be cut down in the fall. That way the plants can naturally reseed for next Spring. Kim captured a beautiful picture of a bee actively working hard in this area. Be sure to check out all the pictures that go along with this article. Kim captures amazing pictures. Can you believe they are all taken on her cell phone?

Men's hole #3 is a must see. Zinnia's that Kim had planted have the area covered in a mass of striking color. They are simply gorgeous.

Tulips will be on sale through the LOFS Garden Club. It is a great way to purchase bulbs. The bulbs are the same brand that we plant in the Fall for Spring display. You will not be disappointed.

With cooler weather just around the corner, have fun planting some radish, lettuce, turnip, collard, and mustard greens, and just about any cool weather vegetable. It is a great time to experiment and try something new. If you harvest them when they are small, they are just as delicious and are called baby greens. Try it and see if you enjoy the flavor.

How many of you had Monarch butterflies visit your yard this summer? I know I did. Perhaps it was the Swamp Milkweed I planted. Or maybe more of you were inspired to go outside and plant some flowers. From what I saw there were many newly planted or expanded garden beds put in this Spring. Not to mention #6 on the golf course has an abundance of Swamp Milkweed. And number 10 has a naturally planted area of Milkweed. Milkweed is essential to the Monarch Butterflies survival. Not only do the Monarch Butterflies eat from these plants, they lay their eggs on them, which grow into a cat-

erpillar. That caterpillar then eats from the Milkweed, creates a chrysalis on that very same Milkweed where it then turns into a, you guessed it, a Monarch Butterfly.

A Monarch Butterfly's life span is only two to six weeks, except for the last generation of the year, which lives up to eight or nine months. This last generation is larger, can fly longer, so it can reach Mexico to over winter.

Milkweed plant excretes a nasty taste that only Monarch caterpillars fancy. In turn that makes the Monarch caterpillar undesirable to birds or other predators. If a bird eats a Monarch caterpillar it becomes deathly ill, lesson learned.

Without Milkweed we have no Monarch Butterflies. So along with planting your Tulips this fall, how about a plan to plant some Milkweed next Spring. The Monarch Butterflies will thank you for

Public Safety Department

Licensed Drivers on POA Roads

Officers from this department are still stopping a lot of kids driving around on golf carts. In some cases, we are finding while they look young, they do possess a valid drivers license. However, there are still kids found without a license who either

have parents who know and think it is ok that they are out, or who are completely unaware due to the hours they work.

We have stopped or chased home some kids that were out harassing people in the neighborhood or, reported to be driving reckless around the streets or golf course area. They were ordered to take the cart home and tickets were sent to the address on file.

In most cases impounding has never had to happen, but tickets have, and in some cases other avenues have to be considered. The POA has the authority to deactivate or confiscate any issued POA decal / barcode. It does not matter if it is on a boat, golf cart, or car, it's still a convenience issued to our residents to help enjoy the areas of the community.

Anyone driving on State issued driving permits still must follow the State restrictions: You may practice driving with a learner's permit only when accompanied by



a licensed driver with valid (not expired, suspended, or revoked) driving privileges who is at least 25 years of age, or with your spouse provided he or she is licensed and at least 21 years of age or older.

New license holders must adhere to the following rules: You may not drive with passengers for 180 days after getting your probationary license, unless you are also accompanied in the front seat by a licensed instructor, an individual with a valid driver's license who is at least 25 years of age or a spouse who is at least 21 years of age. Also, you cannot use any type of telecommunication device while driving unless you are calling 911.

Do Not Drive on Dams

The south end area of Lake Holiday is used often by our residents for fishing, exercise, or quick switch over from Lake County to Porter County when out walking. As of recent we have noticed that someone has been intentionally damaging these access gates on both sides in order to drive their golf carts through.

The POA strictly prohibits any golf cart(s) from travel-

ing through this section of POA owned property. We need to avoid any form of erosion to the dam as well as stop any other incidents from occurring which is why the area is restricted. Anyone found to be driving any motorized vehicle through this area can be cited for illegal use of POA property. Those found to be habitually violating this rule are subject to having their golf cart amenity revoked for the remainder of the year.







Golf Maintenance

Summer is finally over, and it is time to look forward to fall. This summer has been one for the record books.

June, July, and August have been extremely hot and humid for prolonged periods of time. Usually we get a few three to four day stretches of 90 plus degree heat and then it cools down. This year it just seems to last for weeks at a time.

Our area has had more than 30 days above 90 degrees. The nighttime temperatures have been 70 degrees and above not giving the plant enough time to cool down and recover. The fairways have suffered from the heat stress the most. There are stripes in the fairways

where the turf has really thinned out.

I sent the fertilize program to a soil scientist at Sipcam to get a better understanding of why his has happened. According to him the liquid fertilizer I use is a 15-0-15, which is in line with our soil test because we are low on Potassium.

Along with the 0-0-28 used to protect the plant

from Pythium was too much Potassium causing the stomata to close and not allow the plant to exchange gasses. The soluble salts in the liquid fertilizer absorbed the moisture from the plant causing the plant to die. The inconsistent irrigation and excessive play have also played a role in the increased stress on the turf. The affected areas have been over seeded and have started to germinate before the poa seeds.

This fall I am planning on getting a few drainage issues resolved. Most of our drainage ditches need to be cleaned out to allow the ditches on hole 10 and hole 8 need to have trees excavated from the area. There are also several stumps that need to be ground out and soil and seed in their place. The cart path on 9 will also be paved and some patching or seal coating done on a few other paths. We are going to do our best to complete as many projects as we can while still maintaining the course first. Tree work can wait until late fall or winter.

I am low on employees this fall, if you know anyone who would be interested in working on the course or helping maintain the flowers please send them my way.
